

2014 MEDICATION DISPOSAL PROGRAMS

Protect your family, pets, the community and the environment by properly disposing of unwanted or expired medications thru one of the programs noted below. Do not put medications "down the drain" or in the trash. They can end up in surface waters and negatively impact local ecosystems. The preferred disposal option is through special events which ensure safe disposal through incineration.

Saturday February 8th from 10:00am to 2:00pm at the Community Center of the St. Jude Catholic Parish at 801 North Bridge Street in DeWitt.

Saturday March 22nd from 10:00am to 2:00pm at the Bath Township Senior Center at 14480 Webster Road in Bath.

Saturday April 26th from 8:00am to 2:00pm at the Clean Community Event – the location will be provided when an appointment is made.

Friday June 6th from 2:00pm to 5:00pm at the Sparrow Clinton Hospital Pharmacy at 901 South Oakland Street in St. Johns.

Saturday September 13th from 8:00am to 2:00pm - at the Clean Community Event – the location will be provided when an appointment is made.

Saturday September 27th from 9:00am to 12:00pm at the Clinton Community Health Fair at RESA 1013 S. US Hwy 27 #A in St Johns.

Friday December 5th from 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm at the Sparrow Clinton Hospital Pharmacy at 901 South Oakland Street in St. Johns.

The Sparrow Clinton Hospital Pharmacy accepts all non-controlled pills, tablets and liquids year round, free of charge. Please call (989) 224-8155 for details. Residents may purchase a mail back pouch for unwanted medications at most local pharmacies- please call your local store for details. Controlled medications may be dropped off at the Sheriff's Office year round during regular business hours.
