Is it Time for a Trim?

Help prevent weeds running wild by keeping your grass (and weeds) under eight inches tall. Property owners will be notified if there is a violation and, if necessary, billed for mowing services plus overhead costs. (Ordinance 93.50)

Residential Yard Waste Pickup

Arrange for residential yard waste pickup at cityofstjohnsmi.com. Requests submitted by 2 p.m. on Mondays will be scheduled for the same week.

Please bag brush and keep yard-waste piles under four cubic feet (4'x4'x4'). Larger loads can be brought to the self-service facility at the Department of Public Works 1000 N. Business 127.

Off-Street Parking

St. Johns regulates residential off-street parking to improve safety, traffic circulation and aesthetics in our city's residential districts. Ordinance 688, Section 155.341 provides guidance on outside storage of inoperable and unlicensed vehicles, trailers, recreational vehicles and more.

Right-of-Way Areas

- Property owners, with a little pre-planning, you can be reimbursed \$2.50/sq. ft. for sidewalk and driveway repairs. To be eligible, you'll need to obtain a right-ofway permit and pay the fee before any work begins. Construction must meet City Construction Standards and inspections are required. Learn more or apply at cityofstjohnsmi.com/sidewalkdriveway.
- Permits are required prior to performing any work in the street right-of-way such as removing, planting or trimming trees; sidewalk or driveway removal and replacement and any utility service repairs.
- Signage is prohibited in right-of-way areas, on utility poles, and on street and regulatory signs in the rightof-way. Also, keep in mind that commercial signs are not allowed on residential lots (Ordinance 675).

Recreational fires are allowed in the city when properly contained and supervised. To protect air quality, burning leaves and/or brush is prohibited. (Ordinance 388)
