




The west entrance doors of the railroad depot had become unsecure and weathered, resulting in them being replaced. A contractor installed a modern door that maintains the look and style of the original doors.














POLCEDEPARIMENT

Makayla Kent - the department's very first intern. She is attending Ferris State and she exceeded the Departments expectations & assisted in numerous areas.






POLCEDEPARTMENT - BODY CAMERAS



- In November 2023, the SJPD introduced the Body Worn Camera (BWC) program to the community.
- The program is partially funded by a \$25,000 federal grant for essential equipment aligns with best practices.
- Increases necessary transparency and operational accountability with the Department while positioning the forefront of technology and evidence collection.

Spray Park Recirculation System Upgrades – (drain to waste to filtering and recycling water)

- Saves 3 million gallons of water & \$25,000 + per year


