

Fantasy Forest 2.0 is a universally accessibile playscape that has been designed to embrace the City's long history of community and collaboration, while also meeting our modern needs and goals.

Fantasy Forest 2.0 will be a sanctuary where laughter and adventure thrive. The new play structure and enhanced flooring focus on safety, stimulation and accessibility. The estimated investment to construct the full master plan is \$2.4 million.

Thanks to several grants and City funds, we have secured more than half of the necessary backing! Your continued support is crucial to bringing this project to life! City Services & Ordinances

Fall Leaf Collection

Our beautiful tree-lined streets become quite a chore during the fall, don't they? The City's leaf collection program can help make things a little easier.

Collection will begin on or about Nov. 4 beginning on the north side of town. Please pile your leaves in the City's right-of-way area. If no sidewalk, please rake leaves 6 inches behind the curb but not more than 6 feet. NEVER rake leaves into the street.

Once complete, we'll make one final pass to collect late-fallen leaves. Dates will be posted to the City's Facebook page and website. Also, the Department of Public Works, 1000 N. US-127 BR, is open 24/7 and accepts loose leaves and biodegradable yard waste bags (use the Kuntz Dr. entrance behind the Journey Federal Credit Union).

If you plan to bag: Visit cityofstjohns.com and select "Yard Waste Pick-up," to schedule service. Only place leaves and garden vegetation in the bags with no dirt, and please keep them under the 50 lb. weight limit. Be sure to put out your bags before your scheduled pickup date.

Please remember, there are many factors that impact leaf collection—an equipment failure or weather event may delay pickups or end the program early.

October Fire Hydrant Flushing

This work is performed between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. Watch for specific dates in October and April at facebook.com/CityofStJohnsMI and cityofstjohnsmi. com. If water discoloration occurs, run the tap for one or two minutes until it's clear.

Sidewalk/Driveway Approach Replacement Program

Property owners, with a little pre-planning, you can be reimbursed \$2.50/sq. ft. for sidewalk and driveway approach repairs. To be eligible, you'll need to obtain a right-of-way permit and pay the fee before any work begins. Construction must meet City construction standards and inspections are required. Commercial signs are prohibited on residential lots. No signs are allowed in right-of-way areas (between sidewalk and curb), on utility poles, and on street and regulatory signs. Political signs are allowed on personal property and must be removed within five days of Election Day.

Zoning, Building, Utility & Right-of-Way Permits

Permits are required prior to performing any work in the street right-of-way.

Burning Permits

Recreational fires are allowed in the city when properly contained and supervised. Burning leaves and/or brush is prohibited. (Ordinance 388)

Off-Street Parking Regulations

Due to a recent change to Ordinance 688, Section 155.341, a zoning permit is now needed to store a recreational vehicle outdoors between Oct. 16 and Apr. 30. Learn more at **cityofstjohnsmi.com/codeenforcement**; the permit does not need to be renewed if requirements are met.

Trash & Recycling

Granger collects trash (brown lid) on a weekly basis. Please bag all trash, 30 lbs limit per bag.

Granger collects recyclables (yellow lids) every other week. Materials do not need to be sorted—just toss them in your bin. Never put plastic bags of any kind in your bin. They will clog and damage sorting equipment.

- St. Johns Lions Club Recycling Center at 605 N. Swegles St. accepts household recycling.
- St. Johns City Offices recycle alkaline/zinc carbon, lithium, mercuric oxide (button cell) and nickel cadmium batteries at their first-floor offices in the Clinton County Courthouse.
- Bee's Sports recycles auto and marine batteries free of charge at 2138 S. US-127 BR in St. Johns.
- St. Johns Police Department provides free, safe prescription medication disposal. Please, no liquids, aerosols, inhalers, sharps or over-the-counter medications. Sharps may be taken to Granger.
