# Farmer's Market


The farmer's market is located on Maple Street (west side of courthouse) on Saturdays from 8 am-noon until October 30th. You will find the

#### **Summer Tax Bills**

Due

The summer property tax bills were mailed on June 30th and are due August 15th. Payments can be made online Taxes

at cityofstjohnsmi.com & click Online Bill Pay (3% processing fee applies for online credit/debit card payments or \$3.00 E-Check fee), or placed in the white city drop box on the south end of the

Clinton County Courthouse parking lot (near Cass Street), in person at city offices (1st floor, Clinton County Courthouse), or call (844) 623-1635 to pay via phone. If you would like your taxes automatically withdrawn from your bank account, please contact city offices prior to August 12th.

# Water/Sewer Bill Payment Options

If you wish to pay online, visit **cityofstjohnsmi.com** and click Online Bill Pay. You may set up your checking or savings account for Autopay, which is free of charge. You can also call (844) 623-1635 to pay via phone. There is a 3% fee for credit/ debit card and a \$3.00 fee for E-Check.

# **Schedule Your Yard Waste Pick-up**

If you would like your yard waste (brown bag, brush or leaves) picked up at the curb or have a request regarding a city tree in the right-of-way, visit <a href="www.cityofstjohnsmi.com">www.cityofstjohnsmi.com</a> and click Yard Waste Pick Up/Tree Service. You will be asked to fill in your address.

ALL requests MUST be submitted before Tuesday at 8:00 am for the current week Tuesday or Wednesday pickup. Requests made after 8:00 am on Tuesday will be scheduled Tuesday or Wednesday of the following week.

There is also a drop off site available 24/7 for yard waste located at the Public Works Dept. at 1000 N. US-127 BR, St. Johns. The gravel access drive is located off of Kuntz St.

#### Free Compost

Compost from the leaf and yard waste collections is given back to the city residents <u>FREE</u> of charge. Compost is great for gardens and flower beds. Compost is usually available in late fall and is located at the Public Works site, follow the dirt drive behind Journey Federal Credit Union off of Kuntz Drive to compost site.

# **Grass/Weed Height**

Grass and/or weeds cannot exceed a height of eight (8) inches under the weed control Ordinance 93.50. The owner will be notified of the violation. If the owner does not comply with the code, the city will contract to have the site mowed and charge the owner with the actual expense plus overhead.

# **Burning Permit Info.**

The City of St. Johns prohibits leaf and brush burning per Ordinance #388. Outdoor burning may aggravate asthma and other respiratory ailments.

Residential recreation fires (no leaves or trash) are permitted in the city when properly contained & supervised.

# **2022 Elections**

The city will hold two elections in 2022: August 2, 2022



Primary Election and November 8, 2022 General Election. If you have not yet applied for an absentee ballot and wish to, please contact the city at (989) 224-8944 to request an application. # Walker Street Water Main Replacement

Beginning in late July, contractors will be

replacing watermain on E. Walker Street between Baker St. and Scott Rd. followed by curb replacement, road reconstruction and paving. During the construction period Walker Street will be closed to all thru traffic, please plan accordingly and avoid the area if possible. If you are a Walker Street resident, Water Division Staff will be in contact with you prior to the start of the project to discuss driveway access and any disruptions to your drinking water service. Thank you in advance as we continue to improve our drinking water and roadway infrastructure.

# Zoning, Building, Utility & Right-of-Way Permits

Most types of construction such as fences, decks, sheds, etc. require a permit in the City.

Residents desiring to connect to City utilities must obtain a utility permit & pay the fee prior to any work commencing which is done online by visiting <a href="cityofstjohnsmi.com">cityofstjohnsmi.com</a>, click online services, then permits. A permit must also be obtained prior to performing any work in the street right-ofway (sidewalk or driveway removal, removal/planting/trimming trees or utility service repairs).

# Sidewalk/Driveway Grant Replacement Program

Property owners will be reimbursed \$2.50 per square foot

for sidewalk and driveway approach replacement. Sidewalk and approach construction must meet City Construction Standards. Inspections are required.

Work performed without an inspection will not be eligible for reimbursement.

Residents must obtain a right-of-way permit and pay the fee prior to any work commencing which is done online by visiting cityofstjohnsmi.com, click online services, then permits. A permit must also be obtained prior to performing any work in the street right-of-way (sidewalk or driveway removal, removal/planting/trimming trees or utility service repairs).

# Signage in Right-Of-Way

Signage is prohibited in the area between the sidewalk & curb or where these improvements would be located if constructed. Prohibited signage includes real estate & political signs, employment & service opportunities, garage sale signs, etc. Signage is also prohibited on utility poles, which are located in the right-of-way.

#### Off-Street Parking, Open Storage Regulations

Residents are reminded that the city regulates the outside

storage of inoperable and unlicensed vehicles, trailers, recreational vehicles and other materials and equipment on residential properties. Inoperable and/or unlicensed vehicles cannot be stored in the open on private property within the city per St. Johns City Code 94.02. St.



Johns City Code section 155.341 states that vehicles can be parked out in the open only if they are on a paved driveway or parking area. Not more than 3 outdoor parking spaces are permitted on a residential lot. Modifications or repairs to a vehicle that take more than 24-hours are not allowed unless they occur inside an enclosed building. Only one trailer/recreational vehicle can be parked on a city lot year-round if it is on a hard surface only. They cannot be parked in the front or rear yard. Violators can be cited for a civil infraction with fines starting at \$50.00 per day. A violation of this code section is a misdemeanor, which carries up to a \$500 fine plus court costs.

Overnight street parking will ONLY be allowed during the Mint Festival weekend (August 12-14).
